

# Arctic Adventure Entrance



## Supplies:

- White paper roll
- White duct tape
- White felt
- Batting
- LED Spotlights
- 4' X 8' foam insulation board
- Printer
- Projector
- Utility knife
- Paint
- 2 blue poster boards

## Supplies for Arch\*:

- 9 extra large boxes (22" x 22" x 22" or larger)
- Utility knife
- Meter stick
- Packaging tape
- White duct tape
- White paper roll
- Light blue and teal spray paint
- Printer
- Foam core

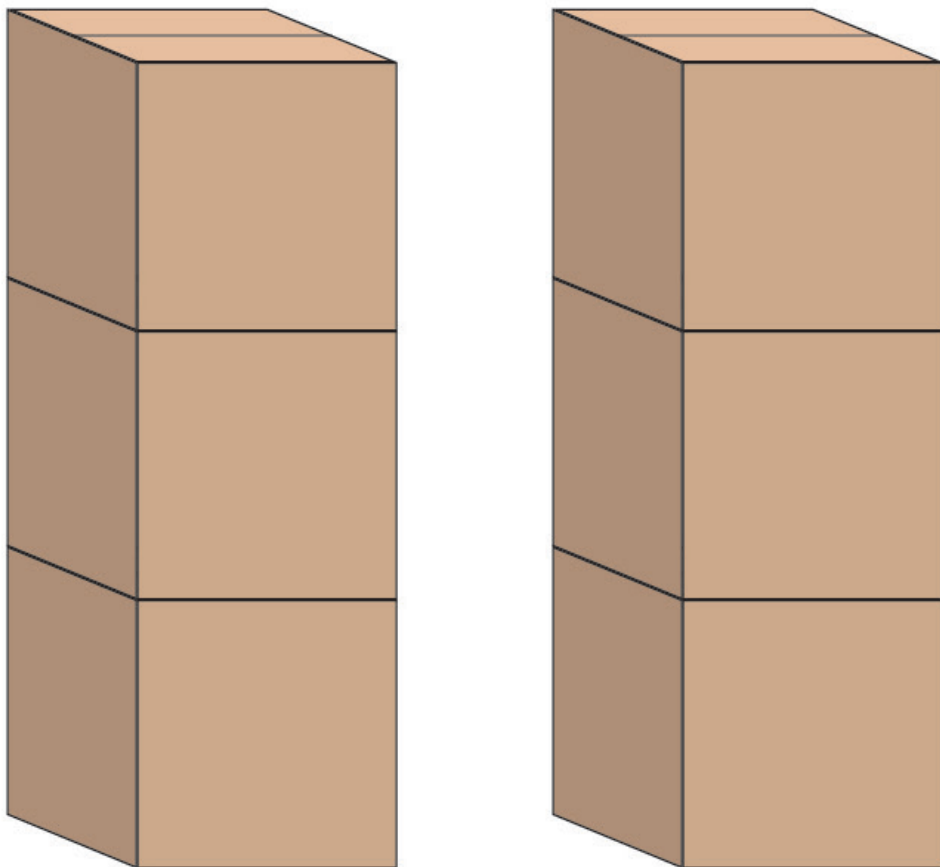

## Directions:

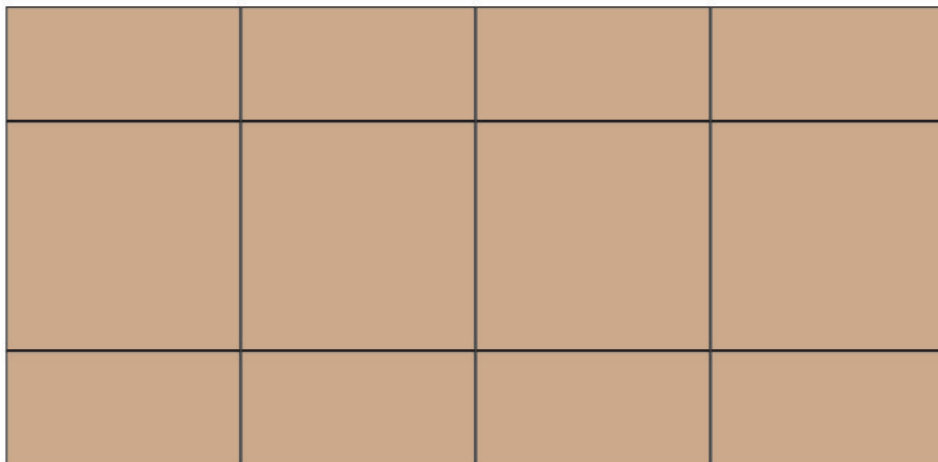
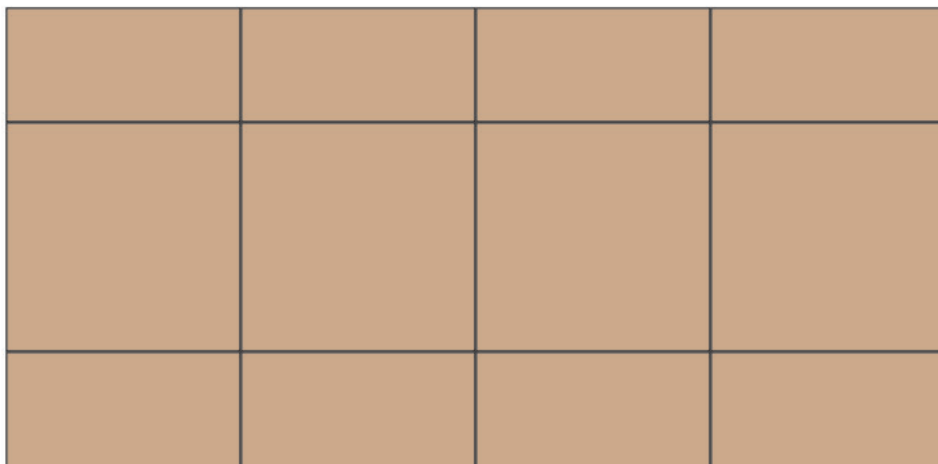
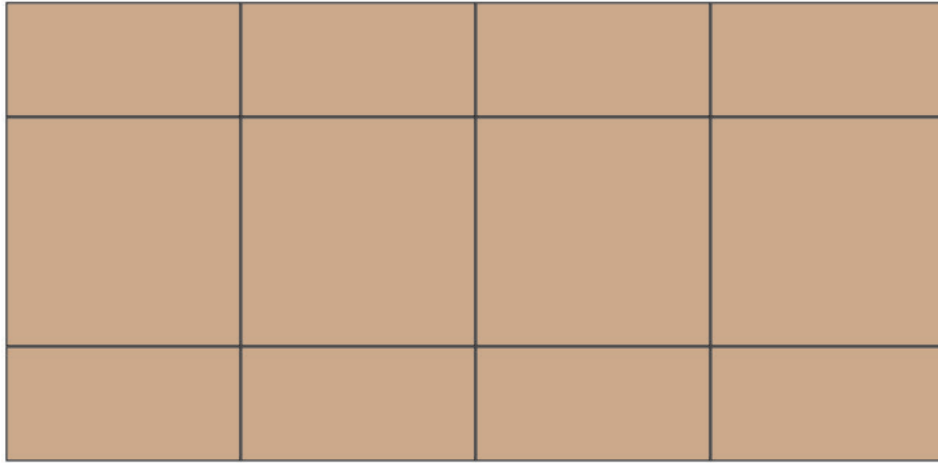
1. If desired, cover the floor with white paper.
2. Place the ice arch over the doorway (see instructions, pages 2 -10).
3. Arrange the glaciers around the entrance. (See separate instructions, Toolkit keyword: ENTRANCE.)
4. Cover the area around the glaciers and arch with white felt and batting to create a snow affect.
5. Hide some colored spot lights behind the glaciers. Shine purple and green light onto the walls to make it look like an aurora borealis.
6. Create arctic animal standees by either printing and mounting them onto insulation board or projecting and painting them by hand onto the insulation board. Cut several triangular easels from scrap foam board and attach them to the back of the standees.
7. Decorate the entrance with the finished standees (see art, pages 11 - 18).
8. For the narwhal standee, tape two blue poster boards together and cut the larger board into a large oval shape. Place the blue oval beneath the narwhal standee so it looks like it's poking out of a hole in the ice.

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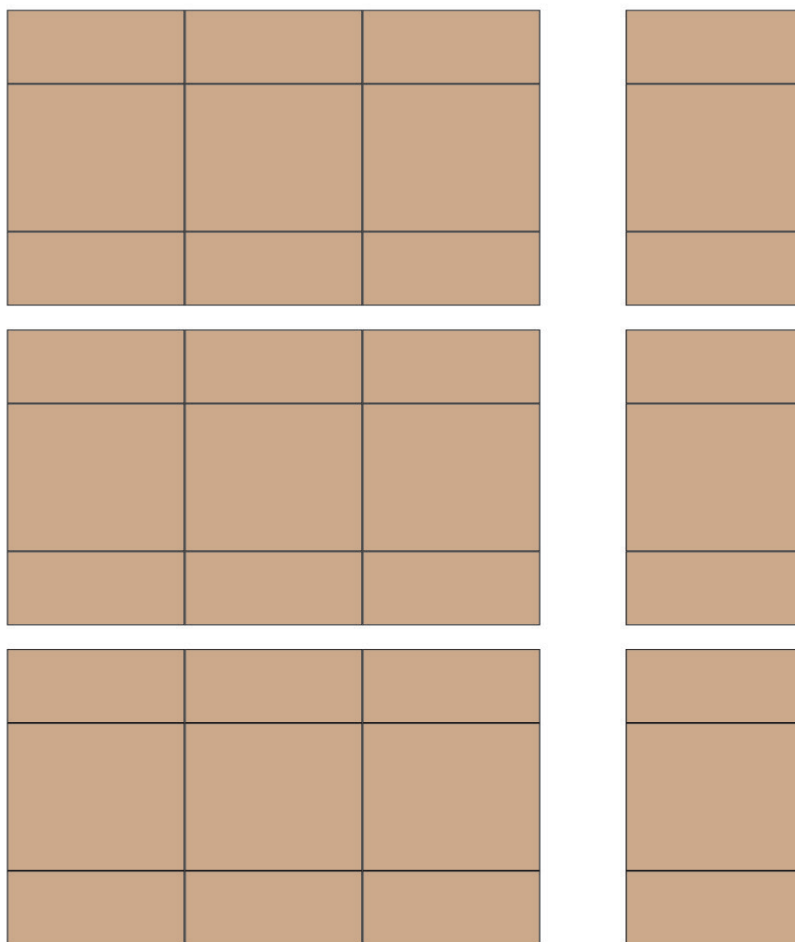
1. Unfold six extra large boxes and close each with tape.
2. Stack three boxes and tape them together to form a column three boxes high. Repeat with the other three boxes to match.



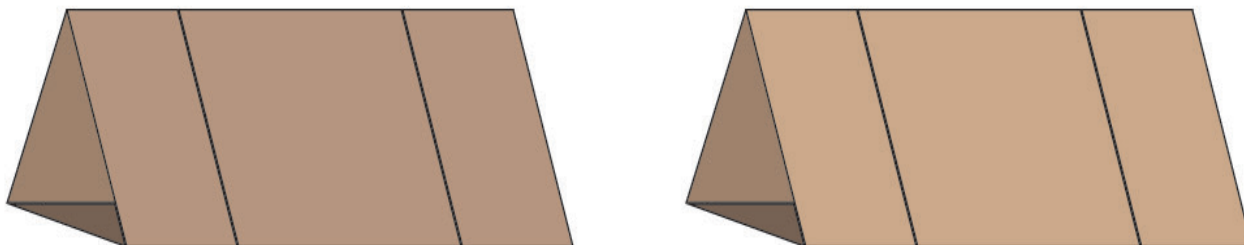
3. Cut open and unfold the three remaining extra large boxes and lay flat.



4. Cut off one of the panels from all three boxes and set aside for step #5.



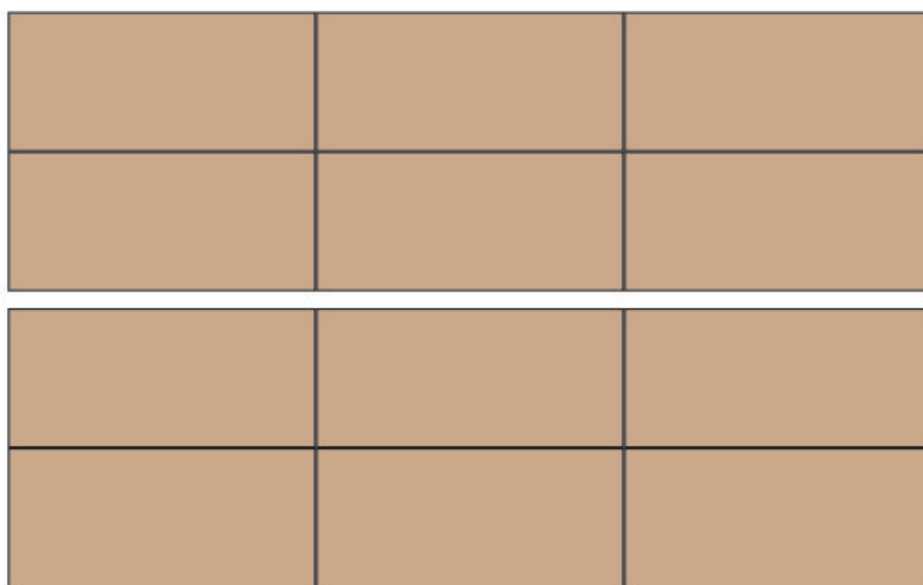
5. Fold two of the smaller box panels into a triangular shape as shown below. Secure the shape with tape along the cut seams.



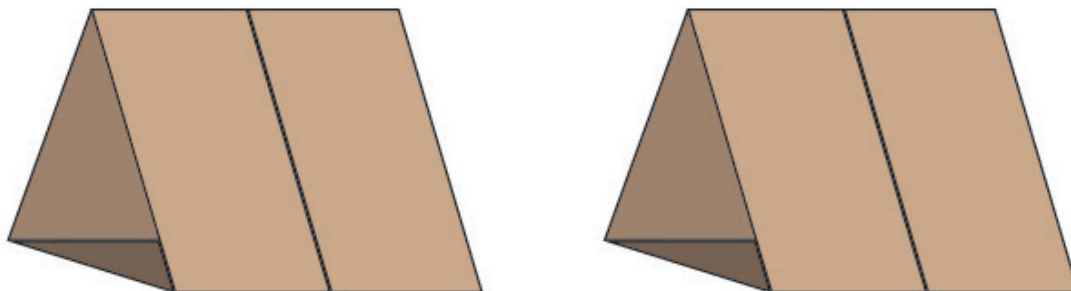
6. Tape the triangular boxes together to form one piece.



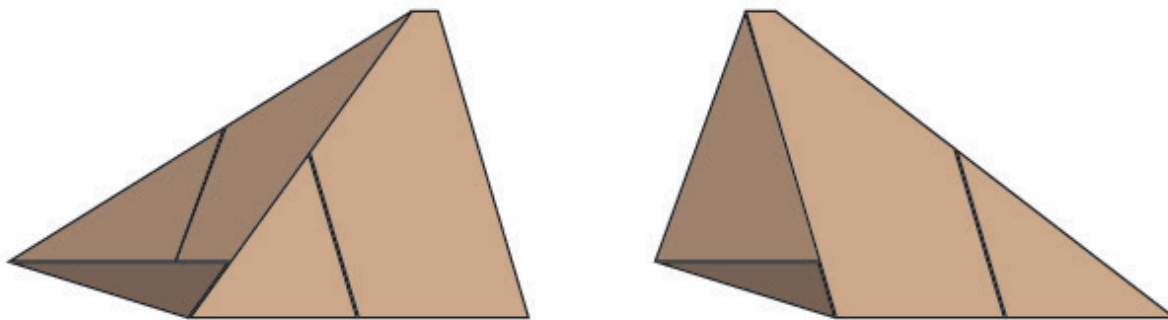
7. Cut the third open box from step 4 in half, like shown.



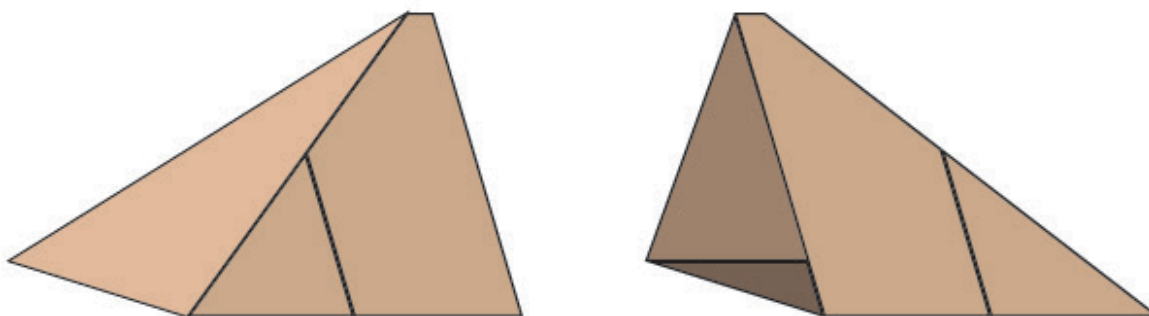
8. Fold the two halves into triangular shapes as well, like shown.



9. Cut the tops off diagonally with a utility knife and straight edge, like shown. *(For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife — never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*



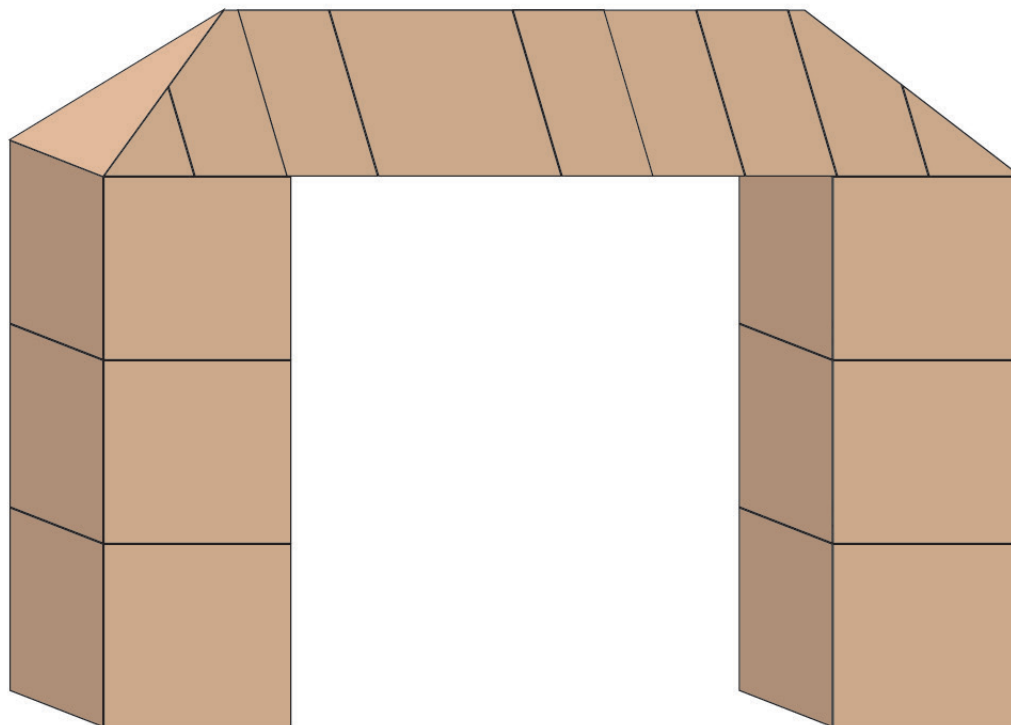
10. Cover the newly cut opening on with scrap cardboard and tape in place.



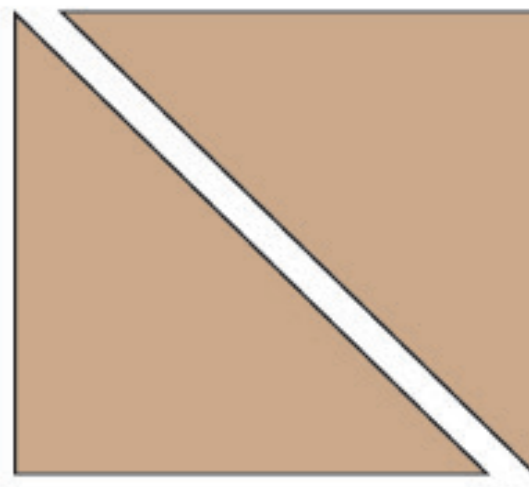
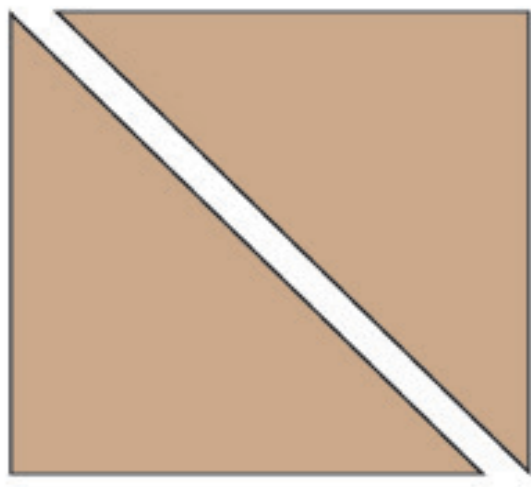
11. Insert the ends of the large piece created in step 6 into the newly created end pieces, like shown. Tape together.



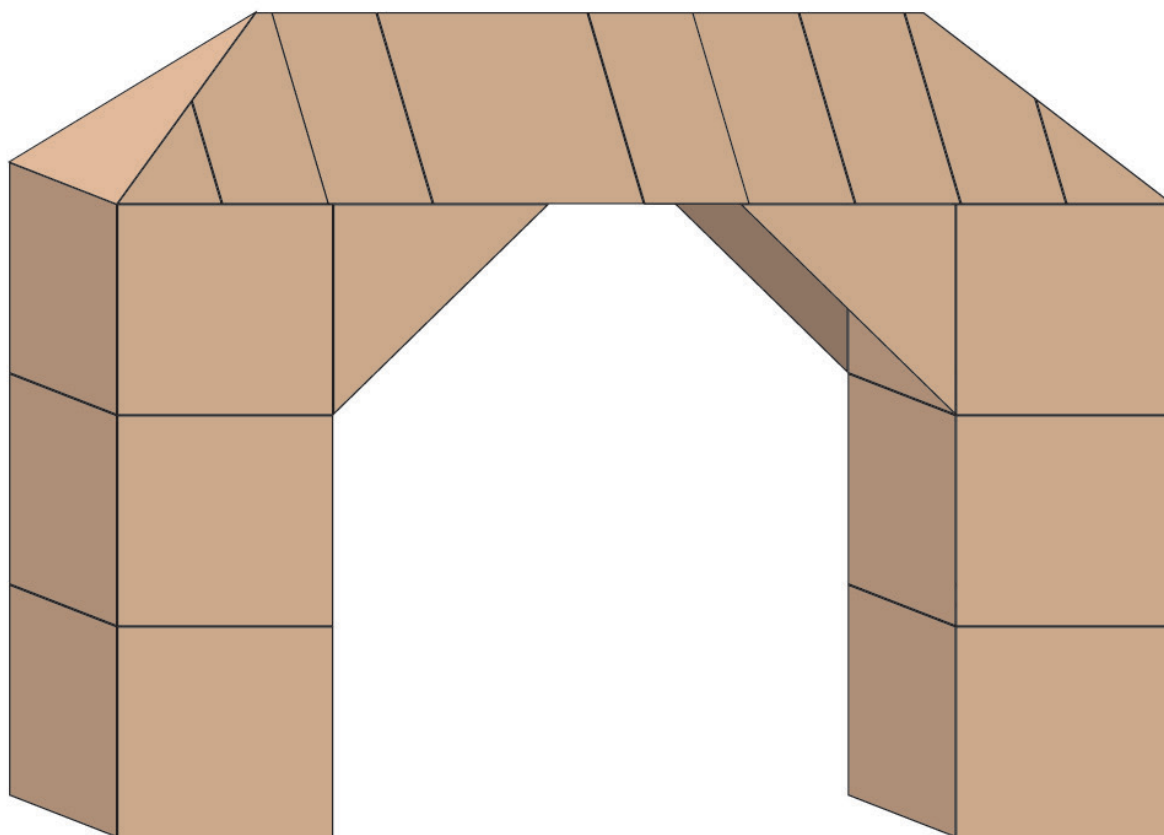
12. Place the finished arch top onto the two columns. Tape in place.



13. Cut two box panels from your scrap in half diagonally.



14. Tape them to the arch entrance like shown.



15. Cut out many large pieces of white paper. Crinkle them and tape the sections together with white duct tape.



16. Cover the arch with the crinkled white paper, taping it in place with white duct tape.



17. Lightly cover the finished arch with light blue and teal spray paint to make it look like it's made out of ice.
18. Print and mount the Book Fair logo onto foam core, attach the logo to the top of the arch with duct tape.
