

Arctic Adventure Paper Plate Crafts



Paper Plate Crafts – Arctic Fox

Supplies:

- Paper plate
- White cardstock
- Googly eyes
- Cotton Ball
- Black marker
- Scissors
- Glue stick or school glue

Directions:

1. Cut a paper plate in half.
2. Take one of those pieces and cut it in half again.
3. Use a black marker to draw a nose onto the pointy tip of the quartered piece of plate.
4. Use glue to attach googly eyes.
5. From white cardstock, cut 4 small rectangles for legs and 2 small triangles for ears.
6. Attach the rectangle legs to the halved plate using a glue stick.
7. Attach the ears to the fox head using a glue stick.
8. Attach the head onto the fox body using glue stick.
9. Tease the cotton ball into a tail shape and attach to body using glue.



Paper Plate Crafts – Narwhal

Supplies:

- Paper plate
- Blue paint
- Blue cardstock (1 sheet)
- White cardstock (1 sheet)
- Googly eyes (2)
- Black marker
- Scissors
- Glue stick or school glue

Directions:

1. Paint a paper plate blue.
2. Cut a tail and fin from blue cardstock.
3. Use glue to attach the tail and fin to the blue plate.
4. Cut a small triangle from white cardstock to be your narwhal's horn.
5. Use a black marker to draw diagonal lines on the triangle.
6. Use a glue stick to attach the horn to the head of the narwhal.
7. Use a black marker to draw a mouth onto your narwhal.
8. Use glue to add a googly eye.



Paper Plate Crafts – Polar Bear

Supplies:

- Paper plate
- White poster board
- Googly eyes
- White pom-pom or cotton ball
- Black marker
- Scissors
- Glue stick or school glue

Directions:

1. Cut a wedge out of the paper plate.
2. Round the corners into paw shapes.
3. Use a marker to create toes on the paws.
4. From white poster board, cut a 4" circle for the face of your bear.
5. Use a black marker to draw a nose, mouth, and whisker dots onto the face of the circle.
6. Use glue to attach googly eyes to the bear's face.
7. Also from white poster board, cut two 1.5" inch circles for your bear's ears.
8. Use a black marker to color in the center of the two ears.
9. Using a glue stick, attach the ears onto the face, and the face onto the plate body.
10. Use glue to attach a white pom-pom or cotton ball to the very top of the plate for a tail.



Paper Plate Crafts – Walrus

Supplies:

- Paper plate
- Brown paint
- White cardstock
- Thick cardboard (cardboard box)
- Toothpicks
- Googly eyes
- Scissors
- Black marker
- Glue stick or school glue

Directions:

1. Paint the paper plate brown.
2. Use a black marker to create a “snout” outline shape and a nose at the edge of the flat part of the plate.
3. Cut a smaller “snout” shape out of a piece of thick cardboard.
4. Poke tooth picks through the cardboard to create whiskers.
5. Trim the toothpicks from behind so the snout and whiskers can be glued to the black snout outline on the plate.
6. Cut two tusks from white paper and glue them to the plate.
7. Attach the snout and whiskers to the walrus face on the black snout outline using glue, covering the top of the tusks.
8. Add googly eyes.
