SUN FACT:

The Sun measures 1,392,000 km across. If the sun were an empty ball, you could fit one million Earths inside it.

NEPTUNE FACT:

Neptune has 4 rings made of tiny particles.

A Jupiter-year is 11.9 Earth years long.

MERCURY FACT:

Mercury is the closest planet to the sun.

EARTH FACT:

Earth is about 150 million km from the sun. It is the fifth-largest planet in the solar system.

A year on Venus is 224.7 days long. That's how long it takes Venus to orbit the sun.

URANUS FACT:

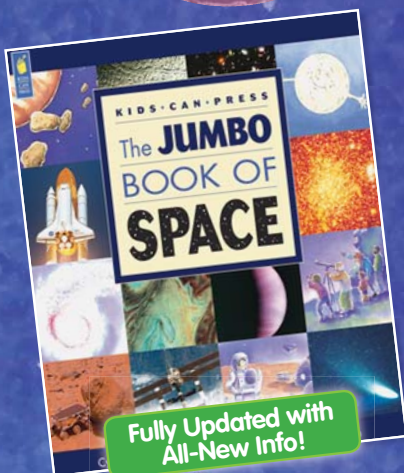
Uranus was the first planet to be discovered with a telescope. It was sighted in 1781.
