Here are some ideas for practicing this essential skill at home:

- **Make it part of family time.**

While preparing a meal, ask your child to help by counting out the ingredients. They might be surprised to discover exactly how many peas go into dinner!

- **Practice making groups of 100.**

With your child, gather 100 objects, like Cheerios or cotton balls. Play around with the way the objects are grouped—in a 10 x 10 square or a straight line. Do different groups look bigger or smaller than others?

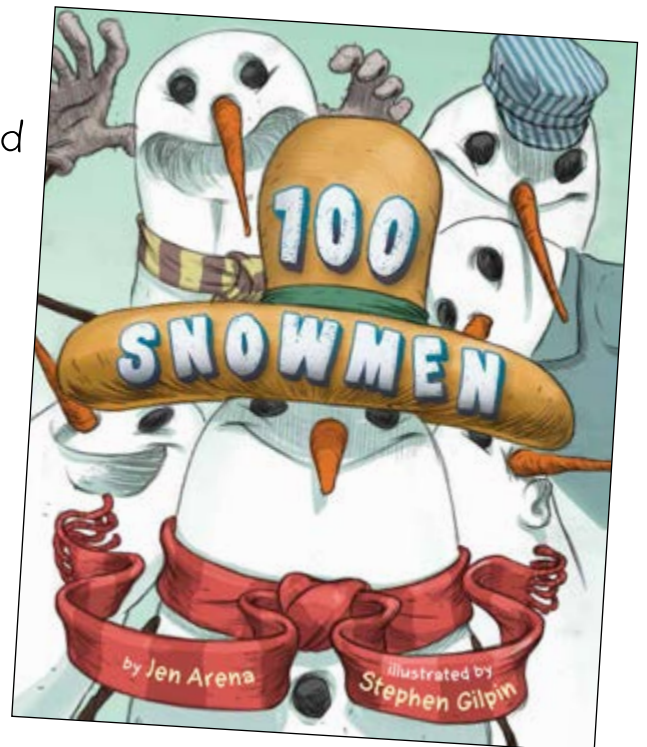
- **Help your child develop different counting strategies.**

Using the objects you collected, count together by 1s, 2s, 5s, and 10s until you reach 100.
