Stage 1:	Writing Behaviour
My Place	Good writers try writing the words they need, even if
	they are not sure about how they are spelled. They
	look closely at the order of the letters and can tell if
	they have put them in the right order.
Look at Me!	Good writers love making up their own stories, and
	they make sure they write all the words they need to
	tell their story.
Having Fun	Good writers remember how to write many words and
	love to learn how to write new words.
How Many?	Good writers love to share their writing with others.

Who?	Good writers make sure their illustrations match their
	story.
Hiding	Good writers try to make their stories interesting for
	their readers.
Toys	Good writers write about things that they know a lot
	about.
Scrub-a-Dub	Good writers read through what they have written to
	make sure that it makes sense to the reader.
Stage 3:	
Shapes I Can See	Good writers use punctuation so that their readers can
	understand their stories easily.
Seasons	Good writers try to use interesting words when telling
	their stories.
I Spy	Good writers check the first, middle, and last letters of
	the words they are writing. They remember how to
	write words they use often, too.
