Telling Stories

Every culture has its own stories. The stories of Indigenous Peoples who they are and where they come from. These stories are passed down from generation to generation.

Indigenous Peoples also tell stories about their lives. These stories tell how the world was made. Color illustrated stories are about animals, like a Raven or a Coyote. Some stories tell of a place or a person that they talk about often.

In the past, stories were not written down, but they are changing. Today, stories are being written down in books, on video, and on the internet. They are being shared, written, collected, and more.

Meet the puppets
Aunt Cheryl Johnson writes and does puppet shows, and each puppet is based on a story about the Anishinabe.

Language Learning
All students from Kindergarten to Grade 8 are learning to speak Cree. This is the language of the Anishinabe (Dene) people of First Nations. Students are learning Cree for 40 minutes each week. The lessons are simple and include songs, games, and outdoor activities. The goal of the program is to help students learn and understand Cree and their own language.

Project of Heart
The Project of Heart is a program that helps students learn about the history and impact of residential schools in Canada. The program includes a video, a book, and a project. Students are encouraged to create their own projects. The program is available in French, Spanish, and Chinese.

Blanket Exercise
The Blanket Exercise is a visual and interactive learning experience. The exercise helps students understand how Indigenous Peoples have been affected since European first came to Turtle Island. During the exercise, participants take the role of Indigenous people and stand on blankets that cover the ground to represent Turtle Island. As the program unfolds, the blankets are pulled away, and students are asked to stand on their feet. This exercise helps students understand the impact of residential schools on Indigenous Peoples. At the end of the exercise, students are asked to reflect on what they have learned and how they can help Indigenous Peoples.
