

An informational book including photos and facts about different animals that live in the lake and their various adaptations, such as fins, gills, webbed feet, shells, pouches, and curved bills.







An informational text with an introductory note to educators, this book contains many interesting facts about sharks, with critical thinking questions sprinkled throughout.




Klink and Klank

A delightful story about how Andy tries to raise money from a barn sale to buy a gift for his grandmother, and the complications that ensue. This story includes many good examples of lists.


