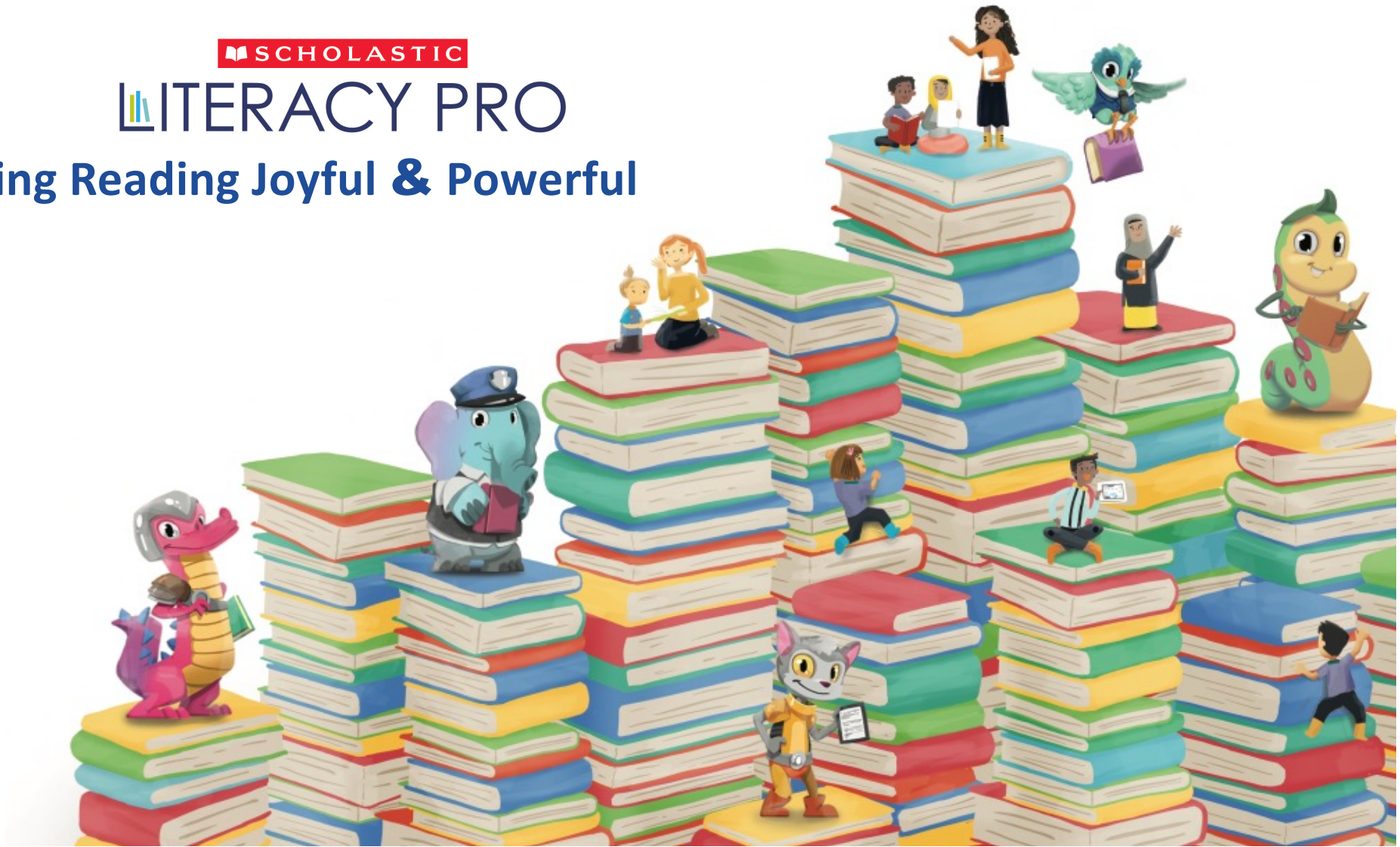




Finally, neighbors decided to do something. They decided to fix up the lot.



Introduce the Book

Say: We are going to read a book called *The Garden on Green Street* by Meish Goldish. We will learn how to achieve something if all of us work together.

Before You Read


- **Ask:** Just by looking at the cover, what do you think the story is about?
- Show students  **Making Predictions.**
- Tell students that they can sometimes make predictions about a story by looking at the cover. They can fill in the boxes of the graphic organizer by looking at the title and the cover. They can also make a prediction of what they think the story is about.
- Possible answers are shown below.

What the Title Tells Me:

- "Green Street" is probably the name of a road.
- There is a garden on that road.

What the Cover Tells Me:


- It shows a street with people living there.
- There is a bulldozer on the street.
- The bulldozer is moving the back of the street.
- I do not see a garden on the street.



What the Cover Tells Me:

Bulldozers are used to move soil. I think the bulldozers on Green Street will help move the soil to make a garden. Or...

 As you read, pause and ask students to discuss the points noted below. Click on the  to show students the question for discussion.

Stopping points	Prompts	Possible responses
p. 2 Thinking Within the Text	Why did the neighbors decide to do something with the empty lot? *	Many people dumped trash in the empty lot and made the place look awful. The people who lived there were unhappy about this because they cared for their neighborhood.
p. 4 Thinking Beyond Text	Why do you think the neighbors decided to have a block party? **	The garden had made the neighborhood famous. The people knew that they had done a good thing and wanted to celebrate.
p. 7 Thinking Within and Beyond the Text	What was the purpose of having the march in front of the garden? **	It was to show people that their garden was important and that they didn't want a parking lot.
p. 9 Thinking About the Text	Why do you think the author chose to use a different font here? ***	The font looks like somebody's handwriting. So it stresses to us that this is the letter Ann wrote to the mayor.
p. 14 Thinking Within the Text	Why did the police officer side with the workers? **	The workers had a piece of paper from the court that said they were allowed to dig. That made it legal. So the police officer sided with them.
