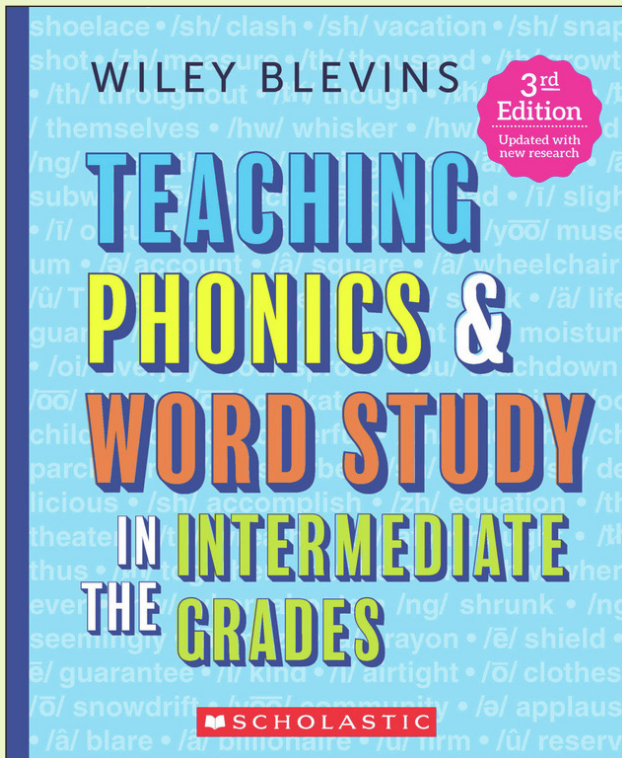


# Teaching Phonics & Word Study in the Intermediate Grades, 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition
