- 6. The rules the British imposed on the Canadians were not much harsher than those in place before the Conquest. Why is Geneviève so angry about those rules?
- 7. What part of her past is Geneviève trying to bury?
- 8. The title of the diary is *Death of My Country*. Do you think this is an accurate title? In what way(s) did Geneviève's country die? Can you think of another title for the diary that reflects her feelings at the end?
